Take A Walk In Our Forrest

As September and October draw near, it's time to think about "a family walk in our woods." If you park your car in the parking lot, you can walk toward RT40. As you pass the Lake, if you look toward the right you can see some examples of our "wet lands". This type of Forest is protected and must remain in its natural state. As you continue you will see large concrete pipe under the road. This stream drains most of our land all the way from Courses Landing road and flows westerly to join with the Salem River. When your walk reaches the Entrance Gate turn around and head back towards where you parked. Don't forget to view the woodlands and the lake. When you see your car you are not done yet! Continue past the club house and the ranges until you see the camp grounds. The Boat ramp is on the right. Continue on the sand trail, you will pass hay fields and forests in their fall colors! You will pass benches along the way to take a break and enjoy the view. Walk a little more and you will pass the caretakers house. Along the trail you will see several stands of native Oak and Maple. Walk to the service Gate, and turn around and return to your Car. When you reach your car, you have walked all most 2 miles and had a opportunity to enjoy our forest.

2016 Canada Fishing Trip

We had another successful fishing trip to Canada this year.

Twenty men went to the Dorval Lodge in western Quebec for a week of fishing and friendship.

The weather was great with temps in the 80s each day and in the 50s most nights. None of the fishermen were rained on while fishing. Two shore lunches were held in two of the few places where a shoreline and beach could be found. The water was high this year making for good fishing. Many walleye were caught but due to the new size limits not many were kept. One

of the sad parts of the trip were the many walleye that exceed the 18 inch maximum keeper size that had to be thrown back.

Northern Pike were biting too for those fishermen inclined to cast or troll for Pike.

At the end of the week the Fishing Pool prizes were won by Alan Marshal for his 15 pound 12oz ounce Northern Pike and John Dyer for his 4 pound 14oz ounce Walleye. The average cost for a person who rents a boat was about \$700 and

the cost for bringing a boat was about \$ 650. This covered

boat/motor, bait, ice, gas for boat, food, lodging, and permits. A fun time for a great price.

SCSC History Brief

SCSC began in 1947 as the Mallard Club and met at the Penn's Grove Citizens League. In 1952, the organization became the Salem County Sportsmen's Club after a small group of founding members purchased the Boardman Farm of approximately 35 acres. 2017 will mark the 70th anniversary of the Mallard Club's vision and 65th anniversary of the SCSC at its current location. The first 35 acres took 65 years to develop by the membership and with the new land acquisition certainly at least that amount of time for the next several generations to work at and enjoy. The original founders of the Club never envisioned that the Club membership would exceed 500.

Clubhouse Christmas Decorating

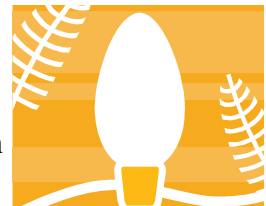

Important!

1. Be sure that you carry your membership cards while you are on club property, anyone may ask to see it if you are not recognized.
2. Put your Green 2016 stickers on your rearview mirror that you have received when paying your dues. This helps to distinguish members from trespassers and

3. Stickers are required to be on the back windshield or rear quarter window, contact the office if you have switched vehicles and no longer have the Club Shield on the rear of your car.

Range Badge Information
